



The Millennium Tapestries issued by Guernsey Feb. 10, 1998 provide a pictorial view of the history of Guernsey. Isn't that what tapestries were all about hundreds of years ago? The stamps are in strips of ten and each tapestry emdoidered by a single parish.

- 11th century: La Gran'mère du Chimquière (neolithic stone figure, early inhabitant, long boat, coming of the monks.
- 12th century: Map of Guernsey showing religious sites.
- 13th century: Trading vessel
- 14th century: Archers, monks, island of Jethou.
- 15th century: Harbor with houses around St. Peter Port

16th century: Priests, burning of Catherine Cauchée and her two daughters for heresy.

17th century: Guernsey lilies, privateers returning with booty.

18th century: Crests of Sark and Alderney.

19th century: Hanois lighthouse, postbox, tomatoes.

20th century: Guernsey flag, liberation, German soldier.

These stamps have dark green borders, dark blue seas and dark brown structures making them very hard to reproduce in black and white. The set would be nice to have and you could very easily make an exhibit with the whole set.
